FOREWORD

With the continuing strength and interest in the Asia and Middle East markets Stanley Gibbons Baldwin's are proud to offer a diverse range of material in our current Stamps & Covers of Asia and the Middle East sale. There are of course, many highlights to be found throughout this sale from original untouched collections, a fine display collection of Saudi Arabia, hand painted essays and proof material, postal history and a reference collection of forgeries. One could wax lyrical about all that there is to be found in this sale however, I shall spare the collectors and concentrate on a few highlights.

Firstly, we must begin with the collections compiled by the late Willie King FRPSL of Saudi Arabia. His fine collection was compiled over a lifetime and showcases the classic issues, postally history, modern issues, varieties and his extensive forgeries collection. Perhaps the highlight being his famous 'Hejaz-Nejd to Saudi Arabia 1953' Exhibit. A rare opportunity to acquire such a comprehensive and detailed collection from a famous and respected philatelist.

Further highlights include a unique hand painted essay from China 1932 North-West Scientific Expedition 4c bronze-green composite photographic which slightly differs from the issued design. This lot being just one of many Chinese and related areas = lots we have in this sale and we anticipate much interest and bidding activity when they appear on auction day. Moving towards the sub-continent we as ever have a pleasing range of India and the Indian States, with an 1852 white Scinde Dawk, 1854 classics, Mutiny Mail and a scarce selection of Rocket Mail proofs. From the States a further highlight must be the group of Cochin 1946-48 complete printers sample sheets of the 4p grey-green, 6p red-brown, 9p ultramarine, 2a black and 3a vermillion. These were held in the possession of the vendor's family since partition and are potentially unique!

We are also pleased to offer an original collection of Sarawak which offers much for the collector and the specialist; from the basic stamps, postal history and a well-researched postmark collection. One lot worthy of note is a registered cover written in the hand of James Brooke the first Raja from Singapore to London, bearing India 2a buff and 8a rose in a strip of five, addressed to Burdett Coutts, daughter of the founder of Coutts Bank and philanthropist. A most delightful cover and one which will certainly compliment any Sarawak collection.

In closing we are excited to see how this auction will unfold and hope that bidders will be as classics enthused as we are when these appear under the hammer!

THE WILLIE KING COLLECTION OF SAUDI ARABIA



Willie King FRPSL (1940-2023)

Willie King was born and raised in the village of Fochabers in Moray, Scotland. His lifelong passion for philately began at the age of seven, when he first developed an interest in stamp collecting. Initially focused on Great Britain issues, his collecting interests expanded significantly after he moved to Saudi Arabia to work for ARAMCO in 1977.

While living and working in the Kingdom, Willie became an active and highly respected member of the Arabian Philatelic Society. He held many roles in the society including Secretary, Auctioneer and President. He was known to encourage collectors of all levels to display their collections and made lifelong friends.

Even after returning from Saudi Arabia in 2000, Willie remained deeply involved in the philatelic community. He was elected a Fellow of the Royal Philatelic Society London (RPSL) and was frequently called upon to provide expertisation for the Society, especially on issues related to Saudi Arabian philately.

In recognition of his outstanding contributions, Willie was awarded the prestigious Tom Reilly Award in 2015 and the Alex McConnell memorial medal in 2019. Over the course of his philatelic career, he also earned numerous gold medals and accolades at national and international exhibitions, marking him as one of the leading experts in his field.

Willie King's legacy lives on through his contributions to Middle Eastern philately and the communities he served with knowledge, passion, and generosity.

We shall not however be obliged to refund any amounts if either (a) the catalogue description or saleroom notice at the auction date corresponded to the generally accepted opinion of scholars or experts at that time, or fairly indicated that there was a conflict of opinions, or (b) it can be demonstrated that the Lot is a Forgery only by means of either a scientific process not generally accepted for use until after publication of the catalogue or a process which at the date of the auction was unreasonably expensive or impracticable or likely to have caused damage to the Lot.
